

NATIONAL POLICE PISTOL TEAM TROPHY



The National Police Pistol Team Trophy is a sterling silver loving cup on a wooden base donated by the NRA. It was placed in competition in 1963 for team competition in the NRA National Police Shooting Championships.

Match Conditions:

1963 Police pistol team, four firing members, one alternate, Team Captain and Team Coach, representing any police department stipulated under "Categories" (C4). All individuals named must represent same department. No "pick-up" teams will be allowed. Team Captain and Coach may be firing members if so stipulated on entry forms. Firing to be over the modified Practical Pistol Course consisting of:

STAGE 1 - Seven yards, 12 shots, double action from the crouch position. 20 seconds, time starts with gun in holster and includes reloading for second six shots.

STAGE 2 - 25 yards, six shots kneeling, double action; six shots standing, double action, left hand from behind barricade; six shots standing, double action, right hand from behind barricade.

STAGE 3 - 50 yards, six shots sitting, six shots prone, six shots left hand, police standing from behind barricade, and six shots right hand, police standing from behind barricade, single or double action.

STAGE 4 - 25 yards, six shots standing without support, double action. No barricade or other support is used.

Time: This course will be fired by stages and the times will be as stated. In all stages, time will start with loaded gun in holster and includes time required to reload. Shooters will be standing when time starts.

- Stage 1 - 20 seconds
- Stage 2 - 90 seconds
- Stage 3 - 2 minutes, 45 seconds
- Stage 4 - 12 seconds

Stages will be fired in 1, 2, 3, 4 order and targets will be changed after stages 2 and 4.

1969 Name of above course changed to NRA National Police Course. Stage three changed to single action only in right hand standing from behind barricade. Stage four changed to single action.

1971 Stage four changed to double action.

1972 Stage three changed to double or single action in right hand, standing from behind barricade.

1991 Stage one time limit changed to 20 seconds.
